SCHOLARSHIP RECEPTION JULY 25, 1990

A reception was held on July 25th 1990 at the Canton Garden Center to recognize the recipients of the scholarships awarded by the CLHSAA. This culminated the work done by a committee that, between November, 1989 and February, 1990 met to formulate guidelines for selection and interview procedures.

A total of fifty-nine applications were received from Ohio, Indiana, New York, Pennsylvania, and Utah. Included in the fifty-nine were two Lincoln High School graduates. Many colleges and universities were represented with a variety of career choices among the applicants.

Twenty applicants were chosen by the committee for personal interviews that were held on June 5th and June 12th. The Executive Committee allocated \$9000.00 for distribution to the finalists who were selected at a meeting on June 13th. Grants ranged from \$200.00 to \$1,000.00.

At the reception recipients received checks payable to the respective schools for 1990-91 school year. The members of the scholarship committee took this task to heart. Each worked diligently, dedicating hours together, and apart, to come to the committee's conclusions. The process of elimination was difficult.

1991 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The purpose of the scholarship committee is to award non-repayable grants to deserving students who either attended Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School, or who are lineal descendents of Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School attendees or graduates.

The criteria for selecting recipients is as follows:

- 1. Financial need
- 2. Scholastic Achievement
- 3. ACT or SAT scores if available
- Residential and or school community involvement
- 5. Individual educational objectives
- 6. CLSHAA Application Form
- 7. Recommendations

The Scholarship Committee shall deny no applicant consideration for a grant because of race, color, creed, religion, sex or natural origin. All information supplied by the applicants is strictly confidential with the exception of names, addresses, telephone

On April 5, 1989, this article was in the Canton Repository: Nancy Ross says she is only going about her daily business and doing what she loves to do, and the last thing she thinks about is winning an award. 

DON BONEVICH - ACTOR, NARRATOR, PUPPETEER, POTTER, PAINTER



LINCOLN GRAD TEST PILOT FOR PROTOTYPE AIRCRAFT



BOB PRICE '70

Following graduation, Bob Price attended Case Western Reserve University where he received a BS degree in electrical engineering. While at Case he was a member of the track and wrestling teams. He completed Marine Officer candidate training during the summer of 1972 and received his commission as a 2nd Lt in the USMC in May 1974. He married Bev just before reporting for active duty. His first two years of duty included The Basic School for infantry officer training and then flight training in Pensacola, Fla. for fixed wing and rotary wing flight training. Bob's first tactical assignment was to a helicopter squadron in New River, NC. While there he made cruises to the Mediterranean and Caribbean Seas aboard the Helicopter Carriers IN-CHON, GUAM and GUADALCA-NAL. He received his orders to the Naval Test Pilot School at Patuxent River, Md. during the spring of 1980.

Bob believes Test Pilot School was the most challenging and rewarding year of his career. During his first tour as a test pilot he spent most of his time conducting flying qualities, performance and systems tests on the CH53E (heavy lift helicopter) and AH-1W Super Cobra (attack helicopter). These tests included icing tests, establishing shipboard launch and recovery ordinance separation tests,

service ceiling tests, high altitude performance tests, external cargo load tests and engine out tests. "Additionally, I flew several test programs for electronic countermeasures and night vision systems". In July 1984, he was ordered to Okinawa, Japan and spent the next year assigned to the lst Marine Air Wing Operating in both Korea and Japan.

After returning to the States in August 1985, he was assigned to the Presidential Helicopter Squadron, HMX-1. He spent three years there as a White House Aircraft Commander flying Marine One and Marine Two for President Reagan and then Vice President Bush. In addition to these duties, he was assigned as the Security Officer, in charge of some 130 officer and enlisted military police and responsible for the physical security of the Presidential aircraft and airport facilities. During this time he was also the project officer and test pilot for the upgrades to the Presidential VH-3D Helicopters. Bob also flew developmental tests on the new VH-60 Presidential Helicopters. His tour at the HMX-1 ended when the Marine Corps asked him to take charge of the newly established Naval Air Test Center V-22 Detachment at the Bell Flight Research Center in Arlington, TX.

The detachment is made up of Navy and Marine enlisted personnel who work directly with the contractor in order to determine the reliability, maintainability and supportability of the V-22 Osprey, tilt-rotor aircraft. Price also has a team of government aeronautical and structural design flight test engineers working with the contractors to conduct and evaluate the ground and flight tests. "As a test pilot for the V-22, I recently flew the first phase of government flight tests in which we evaluated the flying qualities and performance of the aircraft. These tests included basic hover and level flight performance, lateraldirectional and longitudinal flying qualities, stall testing and preliminary tests of the aircraft's's mission systems."

During the periods between dedicated government tests, Bob flew with the contractor test pilots evaluating the flying qualities and performance of the aircraft as its flight envelope is progressively expanded. He is currently planning to conduct the initial shipboard testing this fall. Bob and his wife Bev have three children: Tim-15. Jennifer - 13 and Sara - 11 and are residing in Arlington, TX. Price was recently selected for Lieutenant Colonel and is awaiting promotion. Bob's personal message is: "If any LHS graduates are in the area, look us up. Bev and I would enjoy reminiscing about LHS over some Tex-Mex Food and I could provide a tour of the V-test facility and aircraft."
