#### Bill Welch '46

On Monday, July 25, 1994, C.L.H.S.A.A. awarded forty scholarships totaling \$15,250. This was our largest number of awards thus far both in terms of dollar amount and number of young people helped. Canton Garden Center was the site of the Fifth Annual Scholarship Awards Reception.

Again in 1994 there was a wide range of career choices and schools represented in the fifty-nine applications received by the Scholarship Committee. Of those fifty-nine applications, forty were correctly filled in and the required items submitted. Every one of those forty eligible applicants was awarded either a \$250 or a \$500 scholarship.

Any Lincoln Junior or Senior High School attendee or graduate or their lineal descendent is eligible to apply for one

of these grants. The Lincolnite must be a current paid member of the alumni association. Students pursuing ANY type of post high school education are urged to apply. See this year's application on Page 11.

Members of the 1994 Scholarship Committee were Nila Bonevich Welch, Bill Welch, Christine Welch Harrison, and Jim Scott. Guy Bertram was the liaison between the board and the committee. Faye Moore Staugh and her committee prepared and served the reception buffet.

There were eight outstanding people on the ballot for the two three-year trusteeships. Even though only two could be elected, we hope to see the rest of you in other capacities, hopefully volunteering on committees and running for office again. All our members must stay as involved as possible helping to promote the stated purpose of our association—to promote and continue the memories and spirit of Lincoln High School.

The position of Secretary is newly filled by **Barb Wylie McKelvey**. Retiring Secretary, **Karen Gerzina Samuelson**, has done a fantastic job in her dual role as secretary and editor of <u>Echoes of Lincoln</u>, our highly regarded and eagerly devoured newsletter. Fortunately Karen is continuing as editor of the newsletter, and she appreciates receiving items, stories, and profiles of Lincoln alumni. Nominations for officers were held September 1994 using guidelines outlined the Constitution and Bylaws of the Canton Lincoln High School Alumni Association, Inc. The Bylaws further provide that "an association newsletter shall be distributed in October to all members in order to accompany the ballot listing association candidates. Upon the recommendation of the Constitution Review Committee, some changes were made in the Association's Constitution and additional By-Laws were presented. Greetings from the sweltering summer of the South Pacific. While cleaning my office, I found your May 1994 letter and decided to respond as I might be the Lincoln alumnus permanently living the farthest distance from Ohio.

I graduated from Lincoln in 1962, completed a degree in aeronautical engineering (OSU '67), worked in Texas for a couple of years as an engineer, then came here to Fiji in 1970 as a Peace Corps volunteer to teach physics. Since then, I've spent well over half my time away from here but this has been home for a quarter century. My wife is from Fiji and our only child is a 19 year old daughter who is studying at an Australian university.

Fiji is a small tropical island country which is due north of New Zealand, about the same size as Hawaii and as far south of the equator as Honolulu is north. We have a very racially and culturally mixed population of about 800,000 people and rely on tourism, sugar, timber, fish, and garment exports. Despite the size and remoteness, it's reasonably cosmopolitan: the main regional center for trade, education communication, diplomatic offices, etc. for about a dozen other island countries.

Since coming here I've done a masters degree in technology policy (and am about to complete another in environmental management, taught at the local university, been chief planner in the government's national economic planning office, headed the Fiji Dept of Energy, worked for the UN in 20 or so countries, and since 1991 been self employed as a freelance consultant in various parts of the Pacific, Southeast Asia, and the Caribbean on energy policy, environmental policy and generally assessing development assistance programs.

Life never turns out as we'd expected but I have very few complaints, having had the opportunity for interesting and satisfying work in a fascinating part of the world. By the time this arrives in Canton, I'll probably be working briefly in Hanoi-which would have seemed very improbable even several years ago. My main regrets are the long distance from family and friends: a sister (LHS '65) in Massillon, parents in Florida, and friends scattered around the globe. We live in the capital, Suva, which is a couple hours drive or a 30 minute flight from the main resort areas. If you ever come to Suva, call, although there's a good chance I'll be elsewhere.
