

Thanks to all who attended and to the committee for making the event a success. A special thank you to **Bill** and **Peggy Dinger** for donating the hall and grounds.




See, everyone recognizes that Lincoln alumni are fulfilling the motto suggested earlier. We just "refuse to stop having fun!" []

ALUMNI COUPLE DEDICATED TO HELPING OTHERS - Christine Welch Harrison '68

Shortly after returning from The Solomon Islands (1993 Echoes of Lincoln), Bill '46 and Nila Bonevich Welch '47 volunteered to work with the national division of Habitat for Humanity. While in the Islands, they met Habitat volunteers and felt it was a very worthwhile program to help others obtain affordable housing. Over the last several years, they have been traveling to the Carolinas and Georgia working with groups of college student volunteers. Nila describes the experience as, "One which you immediately start to see the effects of your work. In the Peace Corps, it was a longer process to see how the help you brought affected the people." The Welches feel the same about the results of their work with the Red Cross Disaster Services--more of an immediate benefit to the people in need. (In September 1995, the Welches went to St. Thomas, Virgin Islands, to help undo the damage wrought by Hurricane Marilyn.)

So what's next? Both Bill and Nila are currently taking additional training with the Red Cross to also serve on the international level of disaster services. Meanwhile, they share many family activities and projects with their children and grandchildren. They are the parents of **Lee '67**, **Christine Harrison '68**, **Tim '73**, and **Ed '71** who recently passed away. Bill is retired from the City of Canton and keeps busy with a part-time job. Nila is busy with gardening and daily exercise.



SOME THOUGHTS

It's All-City Night! Remember the excitement? Years ago those words brought thousands of fans to Memorial Fieldhouse. In 1995 and 1996 those same words again brought thousands to All-City Night. "Initially, we would have been happy with a crowd of 1,000," admitted former Lincoln cheerleader Janet Weir Creighton '68, one of the organizers in 1995 and 1996. Her dreams were exceeded both years when over 4,000 cheering fans packed the fieldhouse.

The very first all-city doubleheader was played in January 1960. Before that, the city schools faced each other, but not in twin bills. "All-City Night was like nothing else Canton has ever had," remarked one former player. "With all four schools in the fieldhouse at the same time, it was like The games a tournament play-off. were competitive no matter what the teams' records. The excitement was The tradition ended unbelievable." when Lincoln and Lehman were swallowed by a consolidation in the Canton City School System in 1976.

Both All-City Alumni Basketball Nights I & II attracted a great deal of interest from former Canton high school players who were ready and willing to suit up one more time at the fieldhouse. The scorekeeper had to tape three pages together to make one score sheet long enough for the 30-40 man rosters. Former players from 1950 through 1976 played the games in the largest high school basketball arena in Ohio.

Ken Newlon who built Lincoln's strong reputation as head coach in the 1960's, and who coached the Lions to state final four berths in 1962 and 1967, has been there both years to coach our Lincoln "boys" again.

Participants' children, and in some cases grandchildren, witnessed a truly unique occurrence. "This is the way it was a long time ago," commented one observer. "This is the kind of thing we need to show our kids."

The fieldhouse may never have had such large crowds in such good moods. Both years reminiscing was in abundance, smiles were everywhere.

As one local sports writer indicated last year, "...the reunion, never tried until now, was a smash hit."

The fans remembered, and for a few hours it didn't seem to matter that the guys playing were a step or two behind what they once were. It was All-City Night! And if you were there, you probably were a little bit choked up, a little bit tingly, and maybe a little teary eyed. If not, then you probably weren't around for the "real" All-City Nights.

Someone asked the question, "Does anyone else have the feeling that Canton, Ohio is the only place where something like All-City Alumni Basketball Nights could take place?" Where else could all of us go to revisit those fond memories and see such great talent and competition? In a troubled world, its wonderful to be able to come together in friendly competition and relive old memories while making such wonderful new ones. Only in our home town--only in Canton, Ohio--only at All-City Night!



CLHSAA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The purpose of the Scholarship Committee is to award non-repayable grants to deserving students who are either graduates, attendees, or descendents of Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School. Descendents include child(ren), grandchild(ren), great-grandchild(ren), step child(ren), adopted child(ren), or spouse of attendees or graduates who are paid members of CLHSAA for the current calendar year.

The Scholarship Committee will consider all applicants for grants regardless of race, color, creed, religion, sex, or natural origin. All information supplied by applicants is strictly confidential with exception of names, addresses, telephone numbers, and names of ancestors who attended Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School.

CLHSAA reserves the right to determine the amount and number of grants to be presented in any year. Scholarships are awarded to students who are pursuing ANY type of post high school education at any type of accredited school, i.e. college, junior college, technical, or trade schools. 
