




LINCOLN ALUMNI BAND HONORS BAYLESS

A banner honoring the 1945 Lincoln Lions State Co-Champion Football Team and Coaches was presented to the Lincoln family. Long overdue, the banner was dedicated on Saturday night during half time. It will hang in the fieldhouse on permanent display.

Saturday night, April 12, 1997, over 4,000 fans watched Lehman beat Timken 56-48 and then roared as **Lincoln beat McKinley 50-48!!!** It was a crazy, blood and guts, for real ball

LHS Right Defensive End 1955-56 Mike Zettler '57

In my mind, I keep seeing images of Lew playing right defensive end at Lincoln High School--his left hand down in a three-point football stance. (I played on the other side, left end, with my right hand down.)

Lew and I shared many experiences throughout high school. We would always pair off in football practice drills--blocking and tackling. Our head coach, **Paul Delerba**, was a warrior, having been an all-Mid Conference line backer at Miami in the early 1950's. His nose had been broken numerous times--no face masks then. His looks matched his personality. His favorite drill was, "BITE THEM IN THE CHEST." That is, we were supposed to approach a runner with our face up and stick it in their chest while grabbing his legs. This would cause the opponent to fall backward instantly. Of course, Lew and I had figured out the danger to our heads in this drill, faked it, and laughed about it constantly. This helped us a lot because Lincoln coaches liked to drill you until you fell exhausted to the ground.

It was a lot of fun having Lew as a partner. He was always joking. Lew was extremely good-natured and humble. Even though he had been a two-year starter and I one, he never acted superior to me.

Lew was also a fighter. For example, John Ferrall was a star fullback, who, when tackled ("piled on") in practice (he was a bear at 200 pounds), would sometimes kick his spiked shoes around in the pile-up. Every practice day ended in a scrimmage with the stars like John, Ron Worstell, Larry Ellison, and George Copeland on offense and underclassmen like Lew, Tom Craddock, Bob Ferry, and me on defense. Getting knocked down every other play was common. (Coach Delerba's favorite saying was, as he looked at me in disgust, "HIT SOMEBODY!") In our last year, even the *Repository* commented on the Lion tendency to make opponents horizontal.

But one day Lew rebelled. He yelled to all of us, "We're not going to take this 'crap' any more!" and started punching John Ferrall through his face mask. A tribal uproar began with much shouting, but most of us just watched Lew and John slug it out. The coaches settled them down, and then Lew showed me his hands. Big chunks of skin had been torn off as his fists hit John's helmet. He was tougher than the average guy!

Lew was not normally wild. Lew and I were in several classes together at Lincoln since our last names were together in the alphabet. He was calm and a pretty good

student. However, one time as sophomores some of us were throwing wet paper towels around. I threw one at Lew and hit his face. He was not in the game and came after me in a serious fashion. I thought, "Uh-oh, I picked on the wrong guy." He stopped short (after throwing the towel back), but it was clear his calm demeanor was beneficial to me.

Lew had no respect for pretense. His sense of humor turned pretense into laughter. Lew was calm, fun, honest, humorous, and tough. It is no surprise to me that hundreds came to his funeral. It's also ironic that 40 years after our last football drill, I lost a significant portion of my vision, and Lew lost his battle with cancer at almost the same point in time. It does not make sense. But I think what does matter is dignity and courage, and Lew showed us these traits continually. I am so grateful he was my friend. I look forward to the day I line up with Lew on the next football field. []

HARRY D. MASON'S LEGACY Lives On From Generation To Generation

As a 1971 Lincoln graduate, I was one of many students privileged to work with Harry D. Mason who led the Lincoln High School choir. I remember him telling us to "throw up when you sing" as encouragement for us to sing from our diaphragm and not just from our throat. He produced a number of musicals in which we performed, and I still have Christmas records that we made under his direction. (Remember records????)

There were some embarrassing moments, however! I remember one incident when I was astonished to see a rubber band from my braces fly out over the heads of other students while I was singing in practice!! Where it landed, I never found out, fortunately! I was too busy looking around to see if anyone noticed!

Mr. Mason expected excellence from us in singing; he expected us to hit a note squarely in the middle, and he was particularly firm about our pronunciation of words. It was not enough to make a nice sound; your listener also had to understand the words! (Which is more than can be said for much modern music today!!!)

I was thinking about Mr. Mason last April. You see, my daughter, Diana, majored in voice and graduated from Interlochen Arts Academy. I believe that Mr. Mason would be pleased that the pleasure in music he transmitted to me was passed along to Diana. Thank you, Mr. Mason! []

Faye Moore Staugh '52


Mr. Lester Kettering received his teaching position at Lincoln High School while the school was still being built. For 47 years he was the physical education teacher at Lincoln.



CLHSAA reserves the right to determine the amount and number of grants to be presented in any year. Scholarships are awarded to students who are pursuing ANY type of post high school education at any type of accredited school, i.e. college, junior college, technical, or trade schools. Checks are made payable to each student's school. An Awards Reception where presentations are announced and recipients honored is held in July.

1997 scholarship application forms were mailed in January along with membership renewal forms. The deadline for 1997 applications was March 15, 1997.

Students interested in applying for a 1998 CLHSAA grant should watch for a scholarship application form which will be included with 1998 membership renewal forms to be mailed in January 1998.
