# The Year 2009

# Abraham Lincoln - 200th Birthday

In 2009, the nation commemorates the bicentennial of the birth of its Sixteenth President, Abraham Lincoln. He was born February 12, 1809, in a log cabin and lived to be only 56 years old. As Americans, we all know that an assassin ended his life. Even though he served less than five years, Lincoln is still considered by many to be the greatest American president ever. He is also remembered as one of the best presidential speech writers. (Remember learning the Gettysburg Address? Or reading his famous second inaugural speech?) Lincoln's words and hopes for this country live on. Mr. Lincoln left America a great legacy.

# Stark County Bicentennial - 1809-2009

The recognition of Stark County's bicentennial has been planned to be a celebration as well as a study of the history of the county-the county where most of us lived and grew up and where some of us still reside. It is also the county where our beloved Lincoln High School is located. The events planned will help remind everyone how far the county has come, how many accomplishments have been made, and how great the people were and are who have helped the county grow into a sprawling collection of thriving communities. Stark County is a metropolitan area with rural roots. Even though the Bicentennial of Stark County has already begun, there are many more events to come. # 700th Scholarship Awarded

The Canton Lincoln High School Alumni Association honored the 2008 scholarship recipients with a dessert reception on July 15 at Westminster Community Church. A total of fifty-four \$500 scholarships was awarded. Since the scholarship program began in 1990, \$349,300 has been awarded to 700 graduates or descendants of Lincoln students.

Seventeen recipients received special scholarships. For the tenth consecutive year, the Ed Mang, Class of 1951, Memorial Scholarship was awarded. Deanne Fitzpatrick Jamal '60 provided eight scholarships In Memory of Olive Fitzpatrick (mother) and David Fitzpatrick '64 (brother). Another memorial scholarship was given In Memory of Venetia Schario by Family and Friends. Other designated scholarships were donated by the Class of 1947 In Honor of LHS Class of 1947, Virginia Easton McMannis '57, Warren C. 



# Our Teacher . . . George Brothers



In October 2008, Mr. Brothers and his wife were guests at the 50th Reunion Celebration of the Class of 1958. He graciously provided this update of his very interesting life. (Note: Edited for the Echoes.)

My teaching career at Lincoln lasted until the end of school year 1962-63, a seven-year adventure. During that time frame, I married a Lincoln graduate, Emily Heinemann '50. That last year at Lincoln, I received an NSF fellowship to attend the University of Virginia, which gave me the opportunity to earn my M. Ed. Although we still had a home in Malvem and had just purchased a small farm near East Rochester, an exciting opportunity arose on the Eastern Shore of Virginia to teach chemistry at a newly formed branch of the University of Virginia at Wallops Station, Virginia. The Branch was started to provide an apprentice program for the NASA facility at that location. In addition to teaching chemistry for the University, NASA was in need of a part-time Analytical Chemist to provide analyses of 90% hydrogen peroxide and later inhibited red furning nitric acid used in two of their rockets, which were launched from Wallops Island. The offer sounded exciting, so off to the Eastern Shore we went.

After teaching for the Branch for five years, the work at NASA (as a contractor) had increased to the extent that I had to make another choice. I had formed a Virginia Corporation, Chemal, Inc., at NASA's request and, although not employed on a full-time basis, the prospects for expansion looked promising, so I left the teaching field. By the early 70's, NASA at Wallops got involved in a balloon bome ozone monitoring system. The system required preparation and calibrating, which was assigned to the Chemistry Lab. That led to field campaigns and a considerable amount of travel preparing, launching, and receiving data from the ozone sensor. Travels included Alaska, Panama, Brazil, the

Congo, Switzerland, Denmark, Shetland Islands, and five three-month campaigns in Antarctica. At present, I still work 2-3 days per week at the Wallops Flight Facility which is near the famous Chincoteague and Assateague Islands.

We have two children. Paul is a Ph.D. biochemist (Case-Western Reserve and U. of Maryland--Baltimore County), and Betsy is a UVA grad. We also have two granddaughters. The older is a student at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, and the younger is a senior at Holy Grove Christian High School.

Emily and I celebrated 51 years of marriage in September 2008. She is retired from 25 years of teaching (two in Ohio) and over 20 years in Methodist Ministry. We have a 34-acre farm and are both active in church work and the Eastern Shore Emmaus Community. I was a Scout Master for 20 years, am the church choir director, and for 20 years or more a member of the Eastern Shore Madrigal Singers. We don't do Madrigal music, but music Miss Cogan would appreciate. We enjoy the longer growing season here on the Shore, so we have a fairly large garden. Just so I would never run out of things to do, about ten years ago I bought my first dozer, then a back hoe, and later another one of each. So I find plenty of work clearing lots, digging ditches, tearing down buildings, etc. No idle time for me. You might also find it interesting that we live in a small town called Assawoman, which has one church, a post office, and about ten homes all surrounded by farmland.

### Fawcett Stadium Gate Project

With the emphasis on Fawcett as a community asset and an historical structure, the Canton Board of Education is pursuing a potential project that would rename the four main gates into the stadium after the four original Canton City High Schools. They have talked with an artist who is interested in designing ironwork that would be representative of each high school. (CLHSAA has requested the LHS lion logo for our gate.) They also intend to sell brick pavers at each gate for alumni to commemorate their graduation year or that of a loved one. The Buildings and Grounds committee of the Board of Education is leading this project, and they will be working through the alumni associations to bring this concept to fruition. # Teacher Recognition . . . Memories of Our Teachers

### **Esther Puterbaugh**

When the Classes of '65-'66 gather together for reunions, there are usually certain faculty members' names that enter into the conversation-Coach Newlon, Mr. Rook, Mrs. Bolster, Mrs. Martin, and Miss Hopkins. There is one name which doesn't seem to generate the same excitement, but who I will always remember. That was my Sophomore English teacher, Miss Puterbaugh.

Miss Puterbaugh used a number of teaching techniques that I wasn't crazy about at the time, but which would eventually serve me well in my thirty-three years of state government service. She used to assign us entire speeches from Julius Caesar to memorize, as well as the Gettysburg Address and the Preamble to the U.S. Constitution. (I still remember a lot of it, too!) Book reports needed to be both hand-written and given orally to the entire class.

The assignment I remember the most, though, was "Find someone in the Canton area who is currently performing the same type of job that you think you want to do and conduct an interview with that person. The interview should include the educational requirements for the job, plus exactly what is involved with that kind of occupation."

I had always been knee deep into history, especially the Civil War, so I chose Edward Heald, who was the head of the Stark County Historical Society (later the McKinley Museum). Besides the Society, he was also a published author of several books, including a major biography of President McKinley. I met with him on a Saturday morning; and, after fulfilling the requirements of Miss Puterbaugh's assignment, he began to discuss colleges that a history major might want to consider. His recommendation was Western Reserve University (later Case Western Reserve University) in Cleveland. When I gave the oral report, I included Mr. Heald's recommendation for college, and Miss Puterbaugh seemed very pleased with the result.

I attended CWRU, but I ended up teaching public health for the New Jersey State Health Department, rather than American history. I've spoken to groups small and large, from orientation classes to meetings with over three hundred attendees. I've even taught some summer school at Rutgers University. Behind it all was Miss Puterbaugh of Canton Lincoln High School, and I thank her very much.

Oh, and the reason she was so pleased with the report on my possible future career in history, I found out later she was a graduate of Western Reserve.

### **CLHSAA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

The purpose of the Scholarship Committee is to award non-repayable grants to deserving students who are either graduates or attendees of Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School or their descendants. Descendants include child(ren), grandchild(ren), great-grandchild(ren), step-child(ren), adopted child(ren), or spouse of attendees or graduates who are <u>paid members</u> of CLHSAA for the <u>current</u> calendar year. If the applicant's **only** lineal Lincoln ancestor is deceased, then the paid membership requirement is waived.

The Scholarship Committee will consider all applicants for grants regardless of race, color, creed, religion, sex, or national origin. All information supplied by applicants is strictly confidential with exception of names, addresses, telephone numbers, and names of ancestors who attended Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School.

CLHSAA reserves the right to determine the amount and number of grants to be presented in any year. Scholarships are awarded to students who are pursuing **ANY** type of post high school education at any type of accredited school; i.e., college, junior college, technical, or trade schools. Checks are made payable to each student's <u>school</u>. An Awards Reception where presentations are announced and recipients are honored is planned for July.

Applicants may apply every year; however, scholarship recipients are eligible only every third year, with a <u>lifetime maximum of two</u> CLHSAA scholarships. Students interested in applying for a 2010 CLHSAA grant should watch for a scholarship application form, which will be included with 2010 membership renewal forms to be mailed in January 2010.

The 2009 scholarship application forms were mailed in January along with membership renewal forms. The deadline for 2009 applications was March 16, 2009.



The Trip of a Lifetime

Raymond A. Cugini '73 had the opportunity of a lifetime when a simple trip to the nation's capital proved to be quite rewarding. A successful reunion doesn't just fall into place, it takes a dedicated group of individuals who are willing to "keep up with" and "track down" classmates continually, not just every five years. CLHSAA attempts to keep information current; and our database "guru" does a fabulous job, but he relies heavily on class members to update themselves as they move from place to place! So, be sure to send or email your current address to CLHSAA. Don't become a "lost" alum!

Depending on the personality of the class, the next reunion might be a simple one where gathering, eating, and socializing are the primary focus. Sometimes loud music is a deterrent to an enjoyable event. Class reunion photos are popular and can be easily arranged locally without any cost to the class. Decor and memorabilia should be kept simple. Class address books are very practical and can be updated easily after the reunion.

Setting a cost for the event should include a little extra to build a "kitty" fund for future reunions. Don't hesitate to run a 50/50 or have donations. Charge the classmate enough, but keep the cost at a minimum-especially during these tough economic times.

With the Internet and cheaper communications, friends and classmates tend to be in better contact with each other on a continuous basis, and the "excitement" of meeting every five years may lose its appeal. Many classes struggle to have well-attended reunions, especially the "younger" classes! The "older" classes seem to realize the value of personal contact and still enjoy festive gatherings. Time passes quickly, and reunion attendance becomes more important as one ages. Don't say you'll attend the next one—attend this one!
