CLHSAA & Rumberger Foundation Scholarships Awarded

The Canton Lincoln High School Alumni Association honored the 2013 scholarship recipients with a dessert reception on July 16 at Westminster Community Church. A total of fifty-two \$500 scholarships was awarded. Since the scholarship program began in 1990, \$ 473,300 has been awarded to 948 graduates or descendants of Lincoln students. For the fifth year, the Rumberger Foundation also awarded five \$ 5,000 scholarships. Gloria Kirkbride Rumberger '61 is the Lincoln connection to the Rumberger Foundation, and CLHSAA is very appreciative of the donation.

Ten recipients received special scholarships. For the fifteenth consecutive year, the Ed Mang, Class of 1951, Memorial Scholarship was awarded. Other memorial scholarships were presented In Memory of Coen & Clara Welling (parents) by Alanna Welling Arnold '69 , In Memory of David Fitzpatrick '64 (brother) by Deanne Fitzpatrick Jamal '60 , In Memory of Patricia Hahn McVay '55 by Jim McVay '51 and family, two scholarships In Memory of F. Stuart Wilkins '45 by Betty J. Wilkins, and The A. Jerd Bayless Memorial Scholarship. Nicci DiMarzio '46 is one highly energetic, enthusiastic, funny and fascinating Lincoln Lion! Every year when we publish our Echoes of Lincoln, the articles include photographs of our alumni. They are nearly all taken by "Nicci," Ardean Huston DiMarzio '46, our "official" Lincoln Alumni photographer.

Nicci was her class historian at Lincoln High School, graduating in 1946 and later attending the University of Oklahoma. She was one of the original founding members of Lincoln Alumni in 1989.

Nicci has kept albums of all of her Lincoln Alumni photographs and has made scrapbooks of every year...filled with articles about Lincoln Alumni members...if you've been in the Repository or in an article somewhere, chances are Nicci has enshrined you in her collection of scrapbooks, which gives us an historical record of the past 25 years and more. She retired at 82 in 2010 and immediately traveled to China, fulfilling a lifelong dream.

Besides her involvement with Lincoln Alumni, where she won the Distinguished Alumna Lifetime Achievement Award in 2012, she's a member of the National "Rosie the Riveter" Association, the Canton Preservation Society, the Canton Ex-Newsboys and the Ben V. Marconi Sons of Italy Lodge #1628.

Nicci's a member of the Football Hall of Fame Luncheon Club where her gifts of fudge are legendary, and has volunteered on many committees during the Football Hall of Fame Weekend. Nicci is also a member of the 101st Airborne Association, and her WWII story was recorded for a PBS documentary. She is the proud mother of three sons, grandmother of seven and great-grandmother of two.

THE LINCOLN BAND - OUR YEAR IN REVIEW

2013 was an interesting and productive year for The Lincoln Band. Our season began earlier than usual when we were invited to participate in Heritage Christian School's "Fine Arts Festival" on the evening of May 3rd. The festival was a celebration of the legacy left to Heritage by Lincoln High School. A grant from "Arts In Stark" helped Heritage Students explore the well-documented history of the Lincoln Lions. All the pre-K through 12th grade students had spent months creating artwork which reflected the time period so well illustrated in Lincoln Yearbooks, which they used as inspiration. The evening featured the walls of the school's hallways lined with the student-produced artwork, producing a veritable "journey through time" from 1942 to 1976 as both Lincoln and Heritage alumni moved through the halls. Inside the "Lincoln-Heritage Room," copies of all Lincoln and Heritage yearbooks, as well as photos from both schools' histories, were displayed.

The evening also included a band concert by all of Heritage's instrumental groups and featured some music composed by Heritage students. The Lincoln Band also participated, presenting music familiar to Lincoln fans in the audience: the marches "National Emblem" and "The New Colonial," and the Lincoln Alma Mater. Also, at their request, we joined the Heritage Band in a joint performance of the Heritage Alma Mater, as a demonstration of our shared respect for their school and the cooperation between our two organizations.

When summer finally arrived, The Lincoln Band took part in our two usual events. The end of July brought the Pro Football Hall of Fame Festival, and we appeared once again in the Community Parade with around twenty band members supported by a contingent of approximately the same number of Lincoln "fans" riding in cars and a small trailer. As usual, we got a terrific reception from the crowd lining the street, and even got some TV coverage as we marched by playing the Lincoln Fight Song!

The beginning of September meant it was time for the Stark County Fair and once again The Lincoln Band performed on the stage of the Entertainment Pavilion behind the grandstand on August 4th. We had a fine turnout by band members which even included a few guest musicians we hadn't seen in our ranks before. In addition, a couple of our clarinet players had switched to playing bass clarinet, and this helped to create a more full-bodied sound in our woodwind section. And, as usual, the Lincoln fans (as well as others) in the audience loved us as we played about eight or ten selections, as always including "National Emblem," "The New Colonial," and the Lincoln Alma Mater! We also added a few of the band members' favorites like "Hosts of Freedom" and "Basin Street Blues." All-in-all, I have to say that the fair concert was another "roaring success!"

With our Association's 25th Anniversary arriving in 2014, our band's planning began in the fall, shortly after the 2013 Fair! In conjunction with the Lincoln Alumni Choir another spring musical event at Heritage School was scheduled and practice dates announced. By the time you read this, our preparations should be well advanced! Watch for announcements elsewhere in "Echoes," and on our Facebook Pages, for details of the events planned! Go, Lions! We hope to see you at every event!

CLHSAA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The purpose of the Scholarship Committee is to award non-repayable grants to deserving students who are either graduates or attendees of Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School or their descendants. Descendants include child(ren), grandchild(ren), great-grandchild(ren), step-child(ren), adopted child(ren), or spouse of attendees or graduates who are **paid members** of CLHSAA for the **current** calendar year. If the applicant's only lineal Lincoln ancestor is deceased, then the paid membership requirement is waived.

The Scholarship Committee will consider all applicants for grants regardless of race, color, creed, religion, sex, or national origin. All information supplied by applicants is strictly confidential with exception of names, addresses, telephone numbers, and names of ancestors who attended Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School.

CLHSAA reserves the right to determine the amount and number of grants to be presented in any year. Scholarships are awarded to students who are pursuing **ANY** type of post high school education at any type of accredited school; i.e., college, junior college, technical, or trade schools. Checks are made payable to each student's **school**. An Awards Reception where presentations are announced and recipients are honored is planned for July.

Applicants may apply every year; however, **scholarship recipients** are **eligible** only every **third year, with a lifetime maximum of two** CLHSAA scholarships. Students interested in applying for a 2015 CLHSAA grant should watch for a scholarship application form, which will be included with 2015 membership renewal forms to be mailed in January 2015. The 2014 scholarship application forms were mailed in January along with membership renewal forms. * The deadline for 2014 applications was March 15, 2014.

Matt Campbell, the son of Elaine Tuesdale Campbell '71, became the youngest FBS head football coach in the country and took the helm at The University of Toledo in the fall of 2013. Campbell returned to Canton to speak at The Hall of Fame Luncheon Club about his team. "We don't think we're underdogs," he said. "We think we're supposed to win."

Campbell has been named one of the best recruiters in the country by Rivals.com. He was the only Mid-American Conference coach to get the award.

Campbell played for Mount Union and helped the Purple Raiders win three Division III national championships as a two-time All American defensive end under head coach Larry Kehres who taught the values of character as well as football. In the locker room at Mount Union were three words: faith, family and football. Campbell has carried that with him and talks to his team about those three things.

His plan to build a sustained program at Toledo is three words...recruit, retain and develop. "We want to recruit great character people who have a passion for football and a commitment to excellence in the classroom," he explained.

Campbell says one of the things he's proudest of is that he changed the program from a "me" program to a "we" program that stresses character, leading his team to develop and grow in what he learned at Mount Union...faith, family and football..

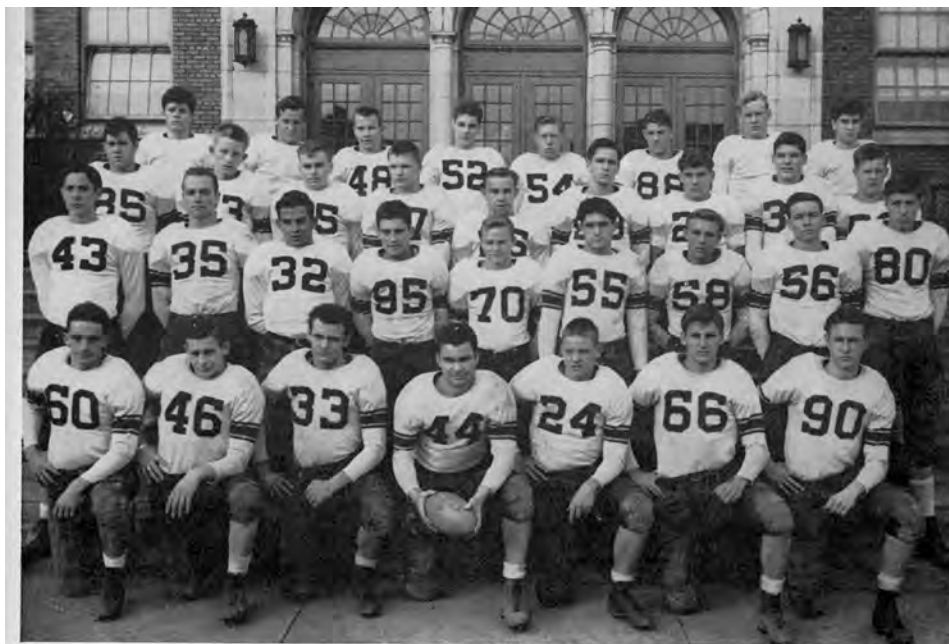

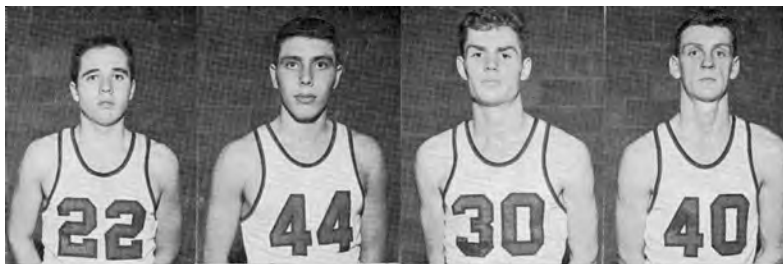

LIONS WIN ALL CITY CHAMPIONSHIP FOR THE FIRST TIME! WIN SECTIONAL & DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP!

The 1958-59 Lincoln Lions basketball team was full of great players, but they weren't playing as a team. "No one thought we could beat anybody," remembers Jim "Ozzie" Osborn '59. "The team was all great players, but we had to learn to work together." Coach Newlon not only got them working together, he got them winning together. Jim Osborn set a new Lincoln record scoring 39 points against Sebring in the second game of the season. Lincoln finished it's regular season 15-3, tying for the all city championship. Jim Osborn and George Saimes were voted berths on the All Greater Canton first team, and Jerry Lyke was given honorable mention. Lincoln was also represented in the All County basketball selections with Jim Osborn o the first team and George Saimes on the second team.

The team rolled through the sectional tournament, beating East Canton, the Timken Trojans and Massillon, giving the lions the Sectional AA trophy. Then the "biggest little team" in the county beat the Wooster Generals and the McKinley Bulldogs, winning the district finals 54-48. Lincoln then lost in the Regional final to the Salem Quakers, having worked their way to the top team in the area.

"We were considered short and inexperienced and were not expected to be winners," Jim chuckles "Newlon told us to spend the summer shooting baskets from the corners. We ran a 1-3-1 about 90% of the time. No one could beat us. Newlon could outcoach anyone around." Jim's love and respect for Coach Newlon is evident. They remained good friends for the rest of Coach Newlon's life.

The Incredible Win over the Bulldogs for the LHS Class of 1964

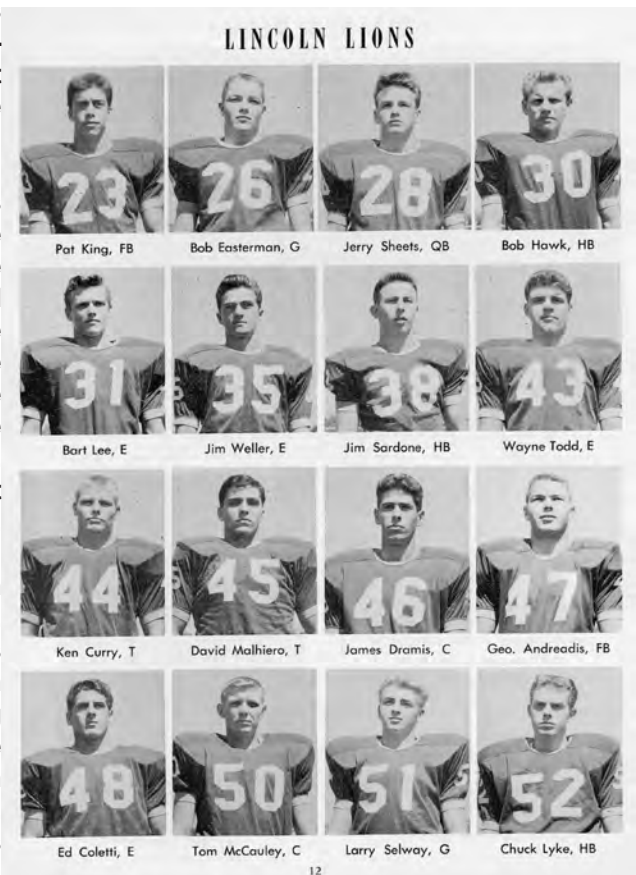


“What are we gonna do tonight?” “Beat McKinley!” That cheer, done only twice a year, for football and basketball; resounded throughout the first floor of the school, as we filed into the auditorium on September 27th 1963, for the Friday afternoon pep rally. The band played their loudest version of the fight song, along with “When the Saints Come Marching In” which really bumped up the excitement a notch.

The McKinley rallies always had a bit more Oompfh to them, especially when we knew we had a good chance to beat the “Dogs” at basketball. But even though we hadn’t beaten them at football since 1953, we knew we had a good enough team to win that year. So the cheerleaders cheered, the majorettes twirled, and Coach Venditti brought the team on stage to talk about the game. We also took a whack at the girls of McKinley when we introduced the McKinley Queen and her Court, represented by five of us senior clowns, who were not afraid to wear a dress. (see photo)

Out at the stadium, it was a cool evening with a noisy crowd. According to Charlie Powell, the excellent sportswriter for the Repository, “they locked horns in a great one, much to the delight of some ten thousand onlookers.” For three quarters it was the irresistible force meeting the immovable object. The arch rivals ran, passed, blocked and tackled in rare fashion, he reported. They were hitting for keeps.” McKinley got the ball on a Lincoln fumble at the 9-yard line, and was poised to score, with 9:52 to play. “However, with their backs to the wall, the Lions staged a tremendous goal line stand, and took control of the ball at their own 2-yard line. They were still in hot water, though, when three plays later they had a punt blocked, and McKinley took over at the Lincoln 8-yard line. “McKinley scored with 5:54 to play and their fans “were making whoopee with plenty of gusto. It looked like the Bulldogs were going to beat the Lions for the ninth straight time.” Lincoln, aided by a 21-yard scamper on the part of fancy-running Bob Hawk, marched to the McKinley 23, before being forced to cough up the ball with 2:10 to go. The Bulldogs could not move the ball, and the Lion defense stopped them at their own 20-yard line. They punted and it went out of bounds in Lion territory. At this point, the Lincoln fans, cheerleaders, and team were screaming our lungs out; hoping for a miracle win over the team we were born to hate. Here you should imagine yourself at the game, as Charlie writes about the last Lincoln charge. “Coach Lou Venditti gave his team instructions to take to the air. Quarterback Jerry Sheets pitched down the middle to Hawk, who caught it at the twenty-five and raced to the seven, for a big 36-yard gainer.” The next pass was to Chuck Lyke who made a fine leaping catch in the end zone for the score.

We had a chance, and the crowd was going crazy. The Lions needed two points for the win, and they were on a roll. Charlie Powell brings it home: “With only 40 seconds showing on the scoreboard, tension was at the bursting point. The Lions needed to plant the pigskin past the final stripe only once more to realize their prized triumph.” They put the two-point conversion in the books, thanks to the combination of Sheets and fullback George Andreadis. Sheets rolled out to his right, lobbed a short flare pass to Andreadis and husky George headed toward paydirt. He was hit by two McKinley defenders at the two yard line, but his momentum carried him across, and the Lincoln players, coaches, and fans let off the victory steam. But it wasn’t over yet! McKinley still had enough time to run six plays down to the Lion 26-yard line, before time ran out. There it was on the scoreboard. Lincoln-8, McKinley-7. As the kids say today, “Sweeet.” That’s just one of the great memories of Lincoln sports that I carry in my “Lincoln file” on my heart’s hard drive. I’m really looking forward to our 50th class eunion this Oct., where I hope to see Andreadis, Hawk, and Lyke once again. All of them have been friends since grade school; but on that special night in 1963, they were Superstars who helped write the headlines “Lincoln’s Aerial Bomb Stuns McKinley 8-7.”



A Lion-Bulldog Matchup for the Ages!

March 1966 District Basketball Championship! Teams: Lincoln vs. McKinley!

I was asked recently to give my best recollection of a huge basketball game against our cross town rival. My thoughts go back two months earlier in January of 1966. We were facing McKinley in an all city game but a lot was at stake as McKinley was ranked #1 in the State and Lincoln was 9th. They beat us fairly handily by 12 points and regained their #1 ranking. We were not so fortunate as we lost 3 more games in a row and were really struggling to regain our early season success. Fortunately, we fought our way back and established a 10 game winning streak leading us to the District Finals game.... Another huge match with McKinley who had retained their #1 State ranking all season with only one loss.

The buildup for this game was huge for all of us on the team. Each practice during the week leading up to the game increased in intensity. I remember getting more nervous and excited every day. I am sure my teammates felt the pressure as well. I remember vividly a pep rally held in the school auditorium the day before the game. This rally seemed different from the others. The noise was deafening and I remember leaning over to Jeff Miller and yelling, "There is no way we can lose this game and let the fans down."

Canton Memorial Auditorium was packed and seemed evenly split with Lincoln and McKinley fans. This game had very special meaning for me. First, I had never been on a Lincoln team that had beaten McKinley. We came close several times but as they say "no cigar." Second, a lot of us on the team had made friends with some of the McKinley players over the years. We had begun competing against them beginning in the 6th grade. First there was elementary school, summer playgrounds, frosh team, and then 3 years of varsity. I certainly cannot speak for all the guys, but for me, this game was the biggest ever in all of my 7 years of youth and high school experiences.

We dominated the Bulldogs for 2 and a half quarters. Jeff Miller, leading us as the best point guard in the county, and Danny Todd shooting lights out and saving us in the end. Jeff Skeeles and Bruce Fowler were beasts on the backboards and Skeeles literally shut down Jerome Jackson, who was considered the best player in the County. Momentum shifted in favor of McKinley in the second half of the 3rd quarter and the fourth quarter. Kind of weird I remember the score, but I am pretty sure the score was Lincoln 43 to 27 when, like a blur, McKinley took a 3 point lead with about 2-3 minutes to go. Not sure how much time was left, but I hit two free throws to cut the lead to one point. Then it happened..... Danny Todd hit a jumper from the baseline that gave us a one point lead with about a minute to go. Our defense held, thanks to a charging call that went in our favor. I can't remember who took the charge but it was huge because it got us the ball back and we were able to melt the clock down to a few seconds before they intentionally fouled me. It was a 2 shot foul and I remember thinking...I gotta make these and we are going to the Regionals. I made the free throws and we all began celebrating at mid court! The locker room was packed with family, students and well wishers! What a great night..... We had just beaten the # 1 team in the State & our cross town rivals!!!!!!

We finished the season at 19 wins and 5 losses. The other guys who did not get mentioned in this recall were: Tim Myer, Al Crissey, Terry Humphrey, Rick Swank and Rick Hoaja. You do not go 19-5 unless you have a great all around team. This request to reflect on this game was enjoyable in so many ways. It was a great night of celebration, but I also have such wonderful memories of being a student at Lincoln. Thanks for letting me share my thoughts.

LIONS ROAR INTO 1965 BASEBALL REGIONALS

As though it weren't enough to beat Lehman High School in baseball when Thurman Munson was on their team, the 1965 Lions Baseball Team wound up with a record season, racking up 13 wins, 8 losses, and a tie, highlighting the season at the Regional Tournament where the Lions had never competed before. Winning 9 of 17 games and tying another, the Lions roared through the Sectional stomping out Fairless (9-1) and Marlinton (8-7). At this point Lincoln's record stood at 11-7-1. Going into the Sectional Championship, the Lions' jaws closed on Sandy Valley in a rousing 4-0 victory. Niles McKinley felt the clutches of the Lions' paws by a score of 9-1 as Lincoln took over the District Championship. The Lions attacked in the Regional Tournament for the first time and were finally stopped at the 13-8-1 mark.

Through long hours of training, Coach Newlon developed the Lions into an experienced and coordinated team of record breakers. Jeff Miller '66 finished with the best pitching record of 9 wins and 3 losses and also had the best batting average of .351.
