

CLHSAA & Rumberger Foundation Scholarships Awarded Roger Hegnauer '71

The Canton Lincoln High School Alumni Association honored the 2014 scholarship recipients with a dessert reception on July 15 at Westminster Community Church. A total of forty-five \$600 scholarships was awarded. Since the scholarship program began in 1990, \$ 500,300 has been awarded to 993 graduates or descendants of Lincoln students. For the sixth year, the Rumberger Foundation also awarded five \$5,000 scholarships. Gloria Kirkbride Rumberger '61 is the Lincoln connection to the Rumberger Foundation, and CLHSAA is very appreciative of the donation.

Ten recipients received special scholarships. For the sixteenth consecutive year, the Ed Mang, Class of 1951, Memorial Scholarship was awarded. Other memorial scholarships were presented In Memory of Coen & Clara Welling (parents) by Alanna Welling Arnold '69, two scholarships In Memory of David Fitzpatrick '64 (brother) by Deanne Fitzpatrick Jamal '60, In Memory of Mary Robinson Miller '56 by family and friends, In Memory of Kathy McCarthy Back '70, and In Memory of Jack Crider '70. Other scholarship grants were donated by Hugh '66 and Suzanne Lotz Clark '66, Linda Gerhart Olson '68, and Janet Weir Creighton '68. The Association is also grateful to the John '46 and Alta Yohn Estate for their generous donation to the Scholarship Fund. That donation benefitted a number of applicants.

Thirty-three of the 2014 scholarship recipients were recent high school graduates, and twelve were current college students. We congratulate all of them and wish them well with their future academic goals.

Applicants who did not receive a scholarship are reminded that they may reapply. Graduates and attendees of Lincoln High School and Lincoln Junior High School, as well as their lineal descendants are eligible for scholarships.



Ed McGrew '46, is an amazing Lincoln Alumnus. If you've been to one of the Lincoln Alumni choir programs, he's the youthful redhead with the "voice of an angel"...still...at 87.

His voice is strong...perhaps from singing with VOCI (Voices of Canton) for the past 60 years. In a recent Repository article, Ed recalled some of his past. He began singing when he was 10 in the St. Paul's Episcopal Church Choir. He started out singing soprano, switched to alto by the time he was at Clarendon Elementary School, and finally back to soprano. He was a member of the choir at Lincoln High School and continued singing when he joined the Navy during the Korean War. He and three others started a men's chorus on the USS Roanoke CL145, a light aircraft Cruiser.

In the article, Ed is described as "extremely talented," "generous," a "gem," a "character" with a "stunning voice" and a "very special man." Ed says of himself, "I just had fun. I've always enjoyed life. I still do."


Lincoln Alums The Stark County High School Football Hall of Fame inducted Lincoln High School players Keith Best '68 and (the late) Mike Rejina '44

In the early 50's a few of us from Meyers Lake walked to school together, lunch in a paper bag and books in hand. We, like you, passed the time talking and joking all the way to school. At the start of the school year the bus driver would see us coming and wait for us, but after we walked by him for a few days in a row he stopped doing that. Winter, it didn't matter if it were freezing or there were inches of snow on the ground. We walked. Wear boots? Are you serious? This was high school. Take the bus? No, thanks! Drive your car? Ha ha! You dreamer! I often wonder what we looked like when we arrived at Lincoln with our shoes and pant legs wet from the deep snow...then cramming our coats into those closets at the back of our home room.

Springtime and the fall of the year were usually less troublesome. The only weather that seemed to change our routine was rain. When that happened a ride to school appeared somehow.

High school, especially Lincoln High School, holds a special and unique place in our lives. We were high energy with few cares or burdens. We were together with a group of people the same age. It was free. Life doesn't get much better than that. Did you ever go back and drive your car over your route to school? Did you ever go back and walk it again? To walk it creates a conflict between memories and reality, then and now, youth and adulthood.


Life continually offers us new opportunities for new memories. I think that is what our teachers were trying to instill in us. I hope they accomplished that in each of us.

CLHSAA 2014 DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS AWARDS

JACK BRANDENBURG, 1969 Category: Business/Civic

Mt. Clemens, MI

Jack graduated from Ashland University in 1974 with a degree in Business Administration. He worked for Bowman Distribution in Detroit until he started his own business, Blue Water Industrial Supply, Inc. in 1979. Jack started his company from the trunk of his car and now does business all over the Mid-West mostly serving the railroad industry. In November of 1963, Jack's dad took him to the funeral of John F. Kennedy and it had a great impact on his life and his desire to serve. In 2002 he ran for the Michigan State House of Representatives and won. He was the first Republican elected to represent the citizens of District 24 in 60 years. He served six years in the State House until he was term limited in 2008. In 2010 he was elected to the Michigan State Senate and won by 30,000 votes. Jack is now 62 years old and has no plans to retire. He met his wife Karen in 1976 and they were married in 1978. They are the proud parents of four children, three boys, Bryan, Rhett and John, and one girl, Paige. In Jack's words, "There is just no substitute for family".





RICHARD P. HOMRIGHAUSEN, 1966 Category:Business/Civic

Dover, OH

Rick graduated from Northland College in 1973 with degrees in Business Administration & Economics and English. He also graduated from the Cincinnati College of Mortuary Science in 1973. Rick currently owns the Homrighausen Funeral Home, R.W. Hoge Wood Products & Awards and the Ozzie B. Golf Company, all in Dover, Ohio. He is a member of the Dover and the Ohio Jaycees and has served as president of both. He was also a member of the United States Jaycees and served on the Executive Board of Directors. Rick holds memberships and offices in numerous associations including the Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church, the Ohio Funeral Directors Association and the Tuscarawas County Improvement Corporation to name just a few. Rick has been the mayor of Dover, Ohio since 1992 making him the longest standing mayor of that city. He has testified before the United States Congress on three separate occasions, all on environmental issues. Rick married his wife Linda in 1980 and they have two sons.

PEGGY CUSHING MILLER, 1944 Category: Athletics/Arts Canton, OH

Peggy has been very active and successful in amateur sports over many years here in the Stark County area. She is an avid golfer and founded the Stark County Women's Amateur Golf Association in 1992 and was its first president. She was the Women's Golf Champion at Tam O'Shanter Golf course in 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1996 and 1997. Peggy was inducted into the Stark County Amateur Golf Hall of Fame in 2011. She was also inducted into the Greater Stark County Tennis Association Hall of Fame in 1996 and managed the Park Centre Indoor Tennis Club from 1974 to 1981. From 1973 through 1978 she co-owned and managed Gymnastics of Ohio, Inc. Peggy also has an extensive background in the Arts as a writer, painter and photographer. She was a writer and photographer for The Canton Repository and authored, illustrated and published a children's book, The Dog Story in 1997. In 1972 she was voted an Honorary Life member of the Players Guild Theatre. Peggy has two sons, William and Doyle, and four granddaughters.



BETTY ANN SABO, 1969 Category: Education

Las Vegas, NV

Betty has spent her career being an outstanding educator and administrator in the Clark County School District in Henderson, Nevada. Her impact of students is reflected in the numerous awards and accolades presented to her and her schools over the years. Green Valley High School had the most National Scholars in the state of Nevada each year she was principal and was named one of the top schools in the Nation by Redbook and Newsweek. Betty Ann's Forensic team at Bonanza High School won five State titles and six Clark County championships. She was voted Nevada Student Council Association Principal of the Year in 2001 and 2002. She was also voted Nevada Music Educators Association Administrator of the Year in 2001, Herr Jones Administrator of the Year in 2001 and inducted into the Clark County School District Hall of Fame in 2003. Betty Ann taught Theater at Bonanza High School and was the Student Government Advisor. At Green Valley High School, her choir won a Grammy award. Betty Ann has thousands of children.





REV. WILLIAM J. YODER, 1959 Category: Religion Chia

Chiangmai, Thailand

Soon after William graduated from the College of Wooster in 1963, he signed up for a special two year term with his home church, Christ Presbyterian in Canton, to minister in Thailand. In 1965 he returned to the United States and entered the Yale University Divinity school. He was ordained and appointed to return to Thailand in 1969 by the Presbyterian Commission on Ecumenical Mission and Relations as a Fraternal Worker to the Church of Christ in Thailand. In 1969 he was appointed chaplain and head of the English Department of the Prince Royal's College. William was transferred to Payap University in 1979. Payap was merged into McGilvary Faculty School of Theology and in 1986, William was appointed Dean of the school. In 1992 he returned to the United States to work many special projects in theological education. In 1996 William returned to Thailand again as Dean of the McGilvary Faculty of Theology. He has raised twenty-seven boys as his sons and currently has nineteen grandchildren.

JIM "OZZIE" OSBORN, 1959 Category: Lifetime Achievement

As a 1959 graduate of Lincoln High School, Jim "Ozzie" Osborn has been heavily involved in the Alumni Ass'n since its inception in 1989. He served as president in 1991, '92 and '93, vice president in '96 and trustee in 1990, 2000, '01,'13 and '14. Ozzie has served on many committees over the years and is the "go to guy" for everything involving Lincoln Alumni. He was a major contributor to our alumni basketball all city nights and is our #1 promoter and ticket seller for the reverse raffle fundraisers. In the community, Jim is a past president of the Hall of Fame Luncheon Club and was elected to the Wall of Fame at the J. Babe Stearn Police Boys Club. He served for many years as an official for boys high school sports activities and is a past president of the Northeast Ohio Basketball and Football Officials Association. CLHSAA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The purpose of the Scholarship Committee is to award non-repayable grants to deserving students who are either graduates or attendees of Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School or their descendants. Descendants include child(ren), grandchild(ren), great-grandchild(ren), step-child(ren), adopted child(ren), or spouse of attendees or graduates who are paid members of CLHSAA for the current calendar year. If the applicant's only lineal Lincoln ancestor is deceased, then the paid membership requirement is waived.

The Scholarship Committee will consider all applicants for grants regardless of race, color, creed, religion, sex, or national origin. All information supplied by applicants is strictly confidential with exception of names, addresses, telephone numbers, and names of ancestors who attended Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School.

CLHSAA reserves the right to determine the amount and number of grants to be presented in any year. Scholarships are awarded to students who are pursuing ANY type of post high school education at any type of accredited school; i.e., college, junior college, technical, or trade schools. Checks are made payable to each student's school. An Awards Reception where presentations are announced and recipients are honored is planned for July.

Applicants may apply every year; however, scholarship recipients are eligible only every third year, with a lifetime maximum of two CLHSAA scholarships. Students interested in applying for a 2016 CLHSAA grant should watch for a scholarship application form, which will be included with 2016 membership renewal forms to be mailed in January 2016. The 2015 scholarship application forms were mailed in January along with membership renewal forms. * The deadline for 2015 applications was March 15, 2015.

Best and Regina Enshrined In Stark County HOF

Two of Lincoln's best all-time, all-around athletes have been inducted into the Stark County Football Hall of Fame, with the class of 2014. Mike Rejina, '44, and Keith Best, '68, have joined former Lions George Saimes and Stuart Wilkins in the Hall.

Mike Rejina was a three sport athlete at Lincoln from 1941-43. He was a three year starter in football and basketball, and captained both as a senior. During the post-depression, early WWII era, Mike played leather helmet, no face mask, football with abandon. He was a fullback and linebacker, and helped the Lions to an 18-6-3 record in his three years.

Both teammates and opponents were in agreement that Rejina was solid muscle, and he wanted to run over people. Don Bonevich, class of '46, played defense against him in practice and said Rejina would "just cream everybody, and get up laughing." Al Michael, Timken HS '43, says "he might have been one of the best to ever come out of Stark County. He did everything."

Mike once scored a then-record 23 points in a basketball game, and threw a no-hitter in Lincoln's first season of baseball in 1944. After graduation, Mike was inducted into the army in August of 1944, and served as an infantryman in the 83rd Infantry Division. He was killed in combat on April 5, 1945; just a month before the end of the war in Europe.

Keith Best's talent matched his boyhood dreams, and he became a three sport athlete at Lincoln from 1965-68. Best played quarterback and lead blocker on offense, but his defensive prowess is what earned him All County, and All Ohio honors before he graduated. In his senior year, Keith and the rest of the Lion defense shut down Barberton's Billy Taylor, a 1,000 yard rusher, and laid an offensive pounding on the Magics, with a 44-9 win. In his final game as a Lion, Best led them to a 14 13 win over Altoona, Pa. It was a great win over a team that had only lost to Massillon.

Keith also played basketball, and was on an Ohio Final Four in 1967. He ran on the track team, along side of future Olympic Gold Medal Winner, Dave Wottle. Keith went on to play starting linebacker for three years at Kansas State, and earned All Big Eight honors his senior year. He played on a team that beat Oklahoma for the first time since 1954.


After graduation, Best went pro, and played in six games with the Kansas City Chiefs in 1972. He was thrilled to be on the Chiefs team that returned him to Canton for the Hall of Fame Game that year. He also played for the Chicago Fire of the World Football League, but injuries put him into retirement from the game. Currently, Keith and his wife Darlene live in San Francisco. He said it was "great feeling" to earn the Stark Hall of Fame honor.

With their induction, these two athletes are showing that the "Lion Still Roars."

Haverstock Sets New LHS Record With 50 Points

Rarely would a player go into a game anticipating a career night, and Rick Haverstock LHS '65, is no exception. On December 11, 1964, Rick felt it was "just another night," but ended up breaking Bill Gribble's previous record of 41, when he dropped 50 points on an outmatched Wooster Generals team.

Wooster came to Memorial Fieldhouse with "a tall but slower team", said Rick, in a phone interview. "Coach Newlon let us run a bit more than usual." The Lions then ran their record to 4-0 with a 75-44 win over the Generals. Rick scored the first basket of the game, and as Charlie Powell wrote in the Repository, "faked the Generals out of their eye sockets. Most of his baskets were made from in close, but he went outside for a few, too." Haverstock knew he was having a good night, but wasn't concerned with numbers. He tallied 15 points in the first quarter, and 10 in the second, but was unaware that he was on a pace to catch or pass the Fieldhouse record of 54, set by Timken's John Namciu in the 1959-60 season.

During warmups before the second half, he said "the guys said they were going to get me the ball, but I just smiled." He just smiled again when, late in the third quarter, Doug Zielasko went into the game, and told Rick "you have 36." Zielasko said from his home in California that he was "very happy to be a part of a history-making game."

For the night, Rick ended by shooting 20 of 29, for 69%, 10 free throws, and 22 rebounds. He was also glad that he could dish out some assists to the other players. In the fourth quarter, he assisted Chuck Dickerson on a layup, and as they ran back on defense, Chuck said "Thanks, Lucky."

Early in his article about the game, Charlie Powell called Rick "the 6-4 smoothie," an embarrassing label Rick has had to live with to this day, (this article possibly rekindling some of those conversations.) But if you ever got to watch him play, you understand the label. That "smoothie" went on to be the top scorer in the city, and make the All-City and All-County Teams.

Rick led the Lions to a very successful 14-7 season that year, and made it to the District Tournament where they lost to McKinley. Following Rick's record performance, two players from Timken also had 50 plus nights. The Fieldhouse record stands at 56 points by Mike Miday. But we know that Rick Haverstock's LHS record can't ever be broken, and he's pretty happy about that.


First Kiss by Tom Beck '54

It occurred to me that we needed to cover Lincoln High School's most popular and participated-in sport...and whether your era called it "spooning," "necking," or "making out," chances are, you could have lettered in it! And where were the favorite places to kiss? My inquiring mind needed to know! Since most Lincoln Alumni didn't marry their high school sweethearts, this article will use no names, initials or even class

years...my lips are sealed! Once I started asking, nearly everyone had information they wanted to share. Our Lions were BUSY!





Some alumni didn't just spend time watching TV in the living room at their parents' home, but also spent time snuggling on the sofa. Couples sometimes found a place to sneak a kiss outside the Lincoln building during school hours and even in the balcony of the auditorium between classes! Many eventually found a romantic place to park.

Apparently, the Akron Canton Airport was a favorite spot. "You could drive right up to the fence and watch the planes landing and taking off on the runway. The lights were beautiful." Some had a code name, "Going to watch the mud puddles," and others just called it "going to see the planes land." One alumnus told me she was quite naive and when a boy asked her to go to the airport to "watch the planes land," she thought he actually wanted to see airplanes. After they got there, he wasn't interested in aviation and she was "NOT that kind of girl!"

Many frequented what was called the "Ninth Street Hill," which was actually Knollwood Street off Perry Road NW.

There were houses being constructed and it was one of the highest points in Stark County, so there was quite a view...as if anyone was looking at the view!

As residents moved into the new homes, they were annoyed with their street becoming a parking lot on weekends and called the police, who arrived one night and took names...and called parents! I went up to take a photo and as I was driving back down the hill...and I swear I'm not making this



bto and as I was driving back down the hill...and I swear I'm not making this up...the car in front of me actually had a Lincoln Lions decal in the back window! What..is there a shrine up there or something?

Another isolated place was off Mount Pleasant Road in North Canton. There was a small dirt lane jutting off beside a cornfield, but the thing was, it was a dirt road. One night after some heavy rains, two couples double dating managed to get hopelessly stuck in the mud. "We had to call our parents and have a tow truck pull us out. We were all so embarrassed! I know our parents had to have privately laughed hysterically over our bad fortune!" Others had gotten stuck that weekend, too, but it didn't "dampen" the allure of that secluded spot! And it's still a dirt road!

Additional well known spots included the Fairgrounds. "You could drive back among the buildings off Wertz right by the Lincoln Alumni office and get real cozy...no one could see you back there!" McKinley's Monument was also an attraction, but not for historical studies. "You could drive up that road on the side and be all alone behind the monument." "The shores of Meyers Lake had several areas, including a place off 20th Street and another off West Park Avenue where you could pull up right beside the lake." The amusement park side of the lake provided quite an atmosphere in the summer, with the moon, stars and thousands of lights reflecting off the lake, the silver rockets circling their neon tower over the lake, the roar of the roller coaster with

the terrified passengers' screams as it raced down the first hill, and the carousel music floating on the warm summer breezes...did anyone do more than Laff In The Dark?

"Brookside Country Club had several exclusive spots...one by the tennis courts and another off Dunbarton Street...you could take the work road and park by the golf course and no one ever came by." There was also a place on the north end of Raff Road in Harter Heights which dipped down so a car wasn't visible, and last, but not least, there was always the romantic parking deck downtown...so you could look at the skyline of Canton with all the sparkling lights.

And the horror stories about parking...who hasn't heard the one about the murderous man with the hook, who preys on parking teenagers? A couple hear a noise and speed off...only to find the hook hanging on the door handle of the car when they arrive at the girl's house. Yeah, scare-y! Surely inspired by this story, I heard all about some of our alumni who went "bushwacking," enjoying the terror they caused among our parking couples. So, it begs the question...how were we so successful in all the other sports with all this romance going on? Yes, absolutely, these parking spots provided some of the greatest moments in Lincoln High School Sports History. Hey, go lions!



Instead, he retrieved a piece entitled, "A Sacred Suite," which the full Lincoln Band had played the previous year. Musical adjustments were made "and, as usual, Mr. Bayless brought out the best in us and we presented a commendable musical tribute in honor of our fallen president."


