# CLHSAA & Rumberger Foundation 1,000th Scholarship Awarded Roger Hegnauer '71

The Canton Lincoln High School Alumni Association honored the 2015 scholarship recipients with a dessert reception on July 21 at Westminster Community Church. A total of forty-nine \$500 scholarships was awarded. Since the scholarship program began in 1990, \$524,800 has been awarded to 1042 graduates or descendants of Lincoln students. For the seventh year, the Rumberger Foundation also awarded five \$5,000

scholarships. Gloria Kirkbride Rumberger '61 is the Lincoln connection to the Rumberger Foundation, and CLHSAA is very appreciative of the donation.

Twelve recipients received special scholarships. For the seventeenth consecutive year, the Ed Mang, Class of 1951, Memorial Scholarship was awarded. Other memorial scholarships were presented In Memory of Debra Notaro Piatt '69 by Alanna Welling Arnold '69, two scholarships In Memory of F. Stuart Wilkins '45 by Betty J. Wikins, In Memory of David Fitzpatrick '64 (brother) by Deanne Fitzpatrick Jamal '60, In Memory of Robert Barr '54 by family and friends, In Memory of Kathy McCarthy Back '70, and In Memory of Jack Crider '70. Other scholarship grants were donated In Honor of Lee Lavery(LHS teacher and drama director), two scholarships In Honor of LHS Class of 1957 by the Class of 1957, and a scholarship given by Janet Weir Creighton '68.

Thirty-two of the 2015 scholarship recipients were recent high school graduates, and seventeen were current college students. We congratulate all of them and wish them well with their future academic goals.

Applicants who did not receive a scholarship are reminded that they may reapply. Graduates and attendees of Lincoln High School and Lincoln Junior High School, as well as their lineal descendants are eligible for scholarships.





Then he slams it into third gear, the pinnacle of perfection. But...he misses and the horrible grinding of the gears draws a shudder from the entire class.

At that time, 1954, it was just a guy missing a shift. But it was probably a better lesson than the teacher was presenting. Life is a series of shifts from one set of circumstances to the next. We want each step, each shift, to mesh together smoothly moving us forward. But sometimes we miss. I'm sure that whoever was driving didn't quit driving because of one bad shift, but was back the next day, speeding past Lincoln, this time making the shift. Life calls us to keep giving our best. Keep trying. Don't ever give up.

# **CLHSAA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

The purpose of the Scholarship Committee is to award non-repayable grants to deserving students who are either graduates or attendees of Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School or their descendants. Descendants include child(ren), grandchild(ren), great-grandchild(ren), step-child(ren), adopted child(ren), or spouse of attendees or graduates who are paid members of CLHSAA for the current calendar year. If the applicant's only lineal Lincoln ancestor is deceased, then the paid membership requirement is waived.

The Scholarship Committee will consider all applicants for grants regardless of race, color, creed, religion, sex, or national origin. All information supplied by applicants is strictly confidential with exception of names, addresses, telephone numbers, and names of ancestors who attended Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School.

CLHSAA reserves the right to determine the amount and number of grants to be presented in any year. Scholarships are awarded to students who are pursuing ANY type of post high school education at any type of accredited school; i.e., college, junior college, technical, or trade schools. Checks are made payable to each student's school. An Awards Reception where presentations are announced and recipients are honored is planned for July.

Applicants may apply every year; however, scholarship recipients are eligible only every third year, with a lifetime maximum of two CLHSAA scholarships. Students interested in applying for a 2017 CLHSAA grant should watch for a scholarship application form, which will be included with 2017 membership renewal forms to be mailed in January 2017. The 2016 scholarship application forms were mailed in January along with membership renewal forms. \* The deadline for 2016 applications was March 15, 2016.



# **CLASS 1975 OF HOLDS 40th REUNION**



# **BESSIE DENDRINOS '66**



Hello to my Lincoln High School friends! I moved to the USA from Athens, Greece in 1961, when I was 11 years old. I spoke only Greek when I came to Canton Ohio, and a little bit of French. There were no support classes at Clarendon Elementary School, where I was enrolled soon after my arrival, for students who were speakers of other languages and who did not speak English. However, I managed to pick it up from my teachers and classmates, a wonderful girl that became my good friend, Helen Laggeris, as well as to teach myself through comic books and TV, with a Greek-English dictionary in hand. In 1962, I was already speaking English at almost native speaker level, and started attending Lincoln High School, from where I graduated in 1966.

I have fond memories of my years at Lincoln, some of which were associated with the Art Club, on which I served as president, with Susie Swihart Vitale '66 as vice president. It was such an immense pleasure to see her when I visited Canton last December, after 50 years.

It was she who asked me to write for The Echo and to include a photo of me going to the senior prom. I promised I would, and here we are: Mike and I, on our way to a dance I do not remember anything about... I'm surprised I located the worn photo, taken with a polaroid camera. I had to take to a shop that restored it for me. I do remember the boy next to me, a Lincoln lad too, two years older than me, and already in college at the time. He was a sweet, gentle and intelligent boy, whose last name escapes me...

There are other memories from my time at Lincoln, which are much more important and valuable to me. Memories of working for the school paper, memories of winning city and state debate and drama trophies, memories of a great coach who was also my English lit teacher. Bobbie Finley, with whom I came to love Joan Baez –a young woman who introduced me to James Joyce's amazing "Ulysses," to Eugene O'Niell's classic plays (my favorites being "Mourning Becomes Electra" and "Long Day's Journey into Night") and to the lyrical poetry of Edna St Vincent Millay. Memories of Ms Montgomery who had 'seduced' me into literature before Ms Finley, by asking me to draw portraits of Emily Dickinson, as I imagined her.



I came back to Athens when I graduated from high school, and loved the way of life so much better in Europe that I decided to stay, though my parents and brother remained in the States. I started out my studies in the Fine Arts School here in

Athens, but ended up studying English Literature and Linguistics. I returned to the USA for graduate studies in California, where I completed my PhD in Educational Linguistics. In 1976, I started working as a teaching assistant at the University of Athens, where I later became Head of Department and Chair of the Faculty, created

a research center for language teaching and testing, that I am still now directing (http://rcel.enl.uoa.gr/dendrinos/index-en.htm). However, this past year I retired from my position as full professor in the Faculty of English Studies after 40 years of research and teaching. I am now professor emerita.

Yet, I'm still professionally active at an international, and European level. Always concerned with languages. My book, The Hegemony of English (Paradigm Publishers, 2003) won the American Critics Award and has been translated from English into several languages. I am also the Chair on the Board of the national foreign languages exam system in Greece, and president of the European Civil Society Platform for Multilingualism.


