


96 YEARS AGO

Canton Announced Plans For A New School

"West-Side Junior High School"

The following announcement appeared in a May, 1921 Canton Repository

Construction of the West-End Junior High School, to be erected on Greenfield Avenue between 6th and 7th Streets NW at an estimated cost of \$760,000, probably will begin late this summer or early fall (see above map for this strange location; was it to be on the east or west side of Greenfield between 6th and 7th?). In addition to the 40 classrooms, it will contain science laboratories, a gymnasium and quarters for the teaching of industrial trades. George F. Hammond, of Cleveland, is the architect (Hammond was also the architect for the current Stark County Courthouse). "This west-end junior high school, with a capacity of 1,200 pupils, is the most needed school building in the city," declared Wilson Hawkins, superintendent of schools. At the present there are some 4,000 Canton school children living west of the B&O tracks (by Shroyer Ave.) who will benefit by the new building. With the opening of this new junior high, the 7th and 8th grades in the west-end grammar schools, as well as part of the 9th grades now at the old downtown Central High (where Timken High now stands) will be transferred to this new building, relieving congestion at Cedar, Clarendon and Dueber Ave. schools. Like the new Lehman High School, this school will afford the opportunity for the teaching of five to six trades. The building will be four stories high of brick and steel construction. Should congestion at the new Mckinley senior high school become too great (and it did), this new building could be used as a senior high school. This 1921 Repository article, plus other details, were unearthed by another 1957 Lincoln grad, Mr. Richard (Dick) White, who does extensive research at the McKinley Museum's Ramsayer Library. continued

SCHOOL BUILDING ON HOLD

By November of 1921, just six short months after the announcement was made of the proposed new West-Side junior high to be built on Greenfield Avenue between 6th and 7th streets NW, the much-needed school project found itself in trouble. Canton city taxpayer, Mr. Fred C. Kirby, of 931 Clarendon Ave. SW, was suing the school board and architect, George F. Hammond of Cleveland, for "collusion and fraud" asking that the court nullify the city's contract to build the new junior high school and not pay the architect the staggering \$45,000 for his building plans. Mr. Kirby's Suit maintained that, in February of 1921, the Canton Board of Education agreed to pay Mr. Hammond 6% of the estimated \$750,000 cost of the building (increased from the original estimate of \$550,000), monies which the Canton school board at that time simply did not have , thereby obligating the "taxpaying citizens of Canton" to end up having to pay for the school. According to Mr. Kirby, the "collusion and fraud" initiated between the architect and the school board members should legally "not be able to stand."

NEW NAME, NEW ARCHITECT, NEW LOCATION AND...QUICKSAND

By May of 1922, exactly one year after the new West-Side school had been announced, the law-suit by Mr. Kirby had been dismissed, George F. Hammond was fired as the architect, the school board was completely vindicated, and its superintendent was given a \$1,000 raise in his yearly salary. The building site was now no longer to be located on Greenfield Avenue between 6th and 7th streets, but on the NE corner of Harrison and 6th Street. The school board had chosen the always popular name of "Lincoln" as the name for the new school (the name of Lincoln also nicely mirrored the name of the Lincoln Highway located just a few blocks north of the school site- the old route #30). The school board hired Mr. Vernon Redding of Mansfield to design a new building(it ended up looking quite similar to, but somewhat smaller than Mr. Hammond's original design). The city followed by issuing a contract to the R.G. Witters Company to prepare the foundation of the \$750,000 building for a fee of \$99,000. The Witters Co. promptly hit 18ft of quicksand in the middle of the building site. The foundation would have to be raised 3 feet and reinforced with pilings to prevent settling. Between 1922 and 1926 there were a number of additional hiccups that would slow up progress, but by the fall of 1926 it was announced that...


LINCOLN JUNIOR HIGH FINALLY NEARS COMPLETION


Finally, five and 1/2 years after it was first announced that the much-needed West-side Junior High School would be built, the Repository announced in November of 1926 that the new Lincoln Junior High was nearing completion and would be – hopefully – open for students in approximately one year, by September of 1927.




Details: Auditorium for 2,500–largest in city; 40 classrooms; large gymnasium seating 1500; Tennessee marble entrance halls; thermostat controlled heating; cafeteria; science & chemistry labs; three large study halls.

After nearly a century of use, time has taken a toll on many portions of our building. Still a magnificent and sound structure, the building is in dire need of renovations, updates, and repairs. In the recent years, Heritage has been proactive by spending more than \$700,000 on repairs and renovations. Although these improvements have helped, much more work remains. As an example, a retaining wall which spans the entire length of the building on its north side and supports a parking lot, is crumbling to the point where it is no longer accessible. In addition, leaking roofs, poor hallway lighting and poorly functioning restrooms are serious concerns. An additional amount in excess of \$4.3 million will need to be raised to complete all of the projects.



Glenn received his Bachelors and Masters Degrees in Journalism from Ohio University and holde a RhD in Journalism from Southern Illinois University Corbondels. He



HERITAGE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL AUDITORIUM SEAT PROJECT

One of the most used and visible rooms at Heritage is the auditorium, which is used for plays, programs, chapel services, concerts and meetings. **Lincoln Alumni has held many concerts and programs in the auditorium.** There are 578 seats in the lower level, many of which are torn, mismatched and without adequate padding. CLHSAA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The purpose of the Scholarship Committee is to award non-repayable grants to deserving students who are either graduates or attendees of Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School or their descendants. Descendants include child(ren), grandchild(ren), great-grandchild(ren), step-child(ren), adopted child(ren), or spouse of attendees or graduates who are <u>paid members</u> of CLHSAA for the <u>current</u> calendar year. If the applicant's only lineal Lincoln ancestor is deceased, then the paid membership requirement is waived.

The Scholarship Committee will consider all applicants for grants regardless of race, color, creed, religion, sex, or national origin. All information supplied by applicants is strictly confidential with exception of names, addresses, telephone numbers, and names of ancestors who attended Canton Lincoln Junior or Senior High School.

CLHSAA reserves the right to determine the amount and number of grants to be presented in any year. Scholarships are awarded to students who are pursuing **ANY** type of post high school education at any type of accredited school; i.e., college, junior college, technical, or trade schools. Checks are made payable to each student's **school**. An Awards Reception where presentations are announced and recipients are honored is planned for July.

Applicants may apply every year; however, **scholarship** <u>recipients</u> are <u>eligible</u> only every <u>third year</u>, <u>with a <u>lifetime maximum of two</u> CLHSAA scholarships. Students interested in applying for a 2018 CLHSAA grant should watch for a scholarship application form, which will be included with 2018 membership renewal forms to be mailed in January 2018.</u>

The 2016 scholarship application forms were mailed in January along with membership renewal forms. * The deadline for 2016 applications was March 15, 2017.


