







It was just a simple cottage-style house when built in 1865 on Canton's N. Market Avenue. But in 1896 it would become one of the most famous houses in America when Canton's William McKinley became the 25th President of the United States while campaigning from its front porch. It has been said that never in American history had a home been so closely connected to the success of an American presidential campaign. Then after President McKinley's assassination in 1901, the home took on even greater importance when it became a shrine to the memory of America's third martyred president. When the home was located on North Market, where now the Stark District Library stands, people came from around the nation just to have their picture taken in front of it. Therefore, when in 1929 it was to be moved to a park beside Canton's new Lincoln Junior High, it was indeed quite an honor for the school. The park just east of Lincoln was to be its permanent home, conveniently located right around the corner from the McKinley National Memorial. The main entrance to Meyer Park was a lovely boulevard that headed southward from West Tuscarawas Street to the front of the famous McKinley home that was now positioned at the north end of Meyer park (a portion of that boulevard still exists today behind a freeway sound barrier). So why is this nationally famous house no longer in Meyer Park? Why, after years of bickering and indecision, did Canton City Council vote to have it demolished, especially after many thousands of dollars had been donated by citizens from around the nation to have it moved section by section to Meyer Park to be preserved as a national presidential historic site? 

Just as the McKinley residence was being moved slowly section by section across town to Meyer Park, our nation's Great Depression hit and the original organization that was backing the home's preservation (The Canton Civitan Club) had to back out due to a lack of funds. Nevertheless, the Canton community, the state of Ohio and the nation were still fully behind the preservation of this historically important presidential home. But now the actual day-to-day future of the home would fall squarely on the shoulders of the elected officials of the City of Canton and its park department, and not on an organization of concerned, private individuals. That, sadly, was the death knell to this famous home's ultimate preservation. During its first two years in Meyer Park everything seemed to be working as planned, and visitors from around the nation were coming to Canton and driving up the boulevard from West Tuscarawas Street to view the famous McKinley Front Porch Campaign House of 1896. But beginning in 1932, Lincoln High's famous neighbor was systematically being ignored by those who were now responsible for its upkeep, and the home began to decay. No caretaker was assigned to reside in the structure (which during the Great Depression many had offered to do gratis), and no fencing was erected to protect the home. Because of the ongoing decay and vandalism that occurred between 1932 and 1935, Canton City Council bickered back and forth between their two parties regarding what should be done about "that dilemma" out in Meyer Park: should they spend some money to fix it up, or should they have the McKinley home demolished? After three years of constant indecision, Canton City Council finally concluded that the easiest solution was to have President McKinley's famous home (what they now deemed an eyesore and civic embarrassment) demolished and have the wood from the home used to construct a "much-needed" storage barn in Nimishillen Park. And that is a very truncated version of the sad details that surround the regrettable saga of how Canton, Ohio became the only town in the nation that did not see fit to preserve its historic, presidential residence, a decision which to this day remains one of our community's greatest regrets. This nationally significant structure was not only the site of one of our nation's most memorable and unique presidential elections, but also the home where William McKinley and his wife honeymooned in 1871 and the home where their two children were born. Since 1990 over ½ million \$ awarded !!

The Canton Lincoln High School Alumni Association honored the 2017 scholarship recipients with a dessert reception on July 18 at Westminster Community Church. A total of fifty-three \$500 scholarships was awarded. Since the scholarship program began in 1990, \$ 575,900 has been awarded to 1136 graduates or descendants of Lincoln students. For the ninth year, the Rumberger Foundation also awarded five \$ 5,000 scholarships. Gloria Kirkbride Rumberger '61 is the Lincoln connection to the Rumberger Foundation, and CLHSAA is very appreciative of the donation.

Thirteen recipients received special scholarships. For the nineteenth consecutive year, the Ed Mang, Class of 1951, Memorial Scholarship was awarded. Other memorial scholarships were presented In Memory of Coen & Clara Welling (parents) by Alanna Welling Arnold '69, In Memory of Debra Notaro Piatt '69 by Alanna Welling Arnold '69, two scholarships In Memory of F. Stuart Wilkins '45 by Betty J. Wilkins, In Memory of Joan Davis Dorkoff R.N. '59 (wife) by Don Dorkoff '59, In Memory of Michael J. DeComoJr., Phd '59 (Harter Elementary teacher and Canton City Schools Principal), In Memory of Kathy McCarthy Back '70, and In Memory of Jack Crider '70. Other scholarship grants were donated In Honor of Lee Lavery (LHS teacher and drama director), two scholarships given by LHS Class of 1957, and a donation from Harold Rogers '48.

Thirty-five of the 2017 scholarship recipients were recent high school graduates, and eighteen were current college students. We congratulate all of them and wish them well with their future academic goals.

Applicants who did not receive a scholarship are reminded that they may reapply. Graduates and attendees of Lincoln High School and Lincoln Junior High School, as well as their lineal descendants are eligible for scholarships.



As a current resident of the Danbury Sanctuary Grande Senior Living Center in North Canton, ninety-one-year-old Nanette DeMuesy (recipient of the Lincoln Alumni Association's Lifetime Achievement Award in 2008) can look back on many happy years of being one of Canton Lincoln High's most ardent boosters. During the 1950s Nan taught English and Journalism at Lincoln and served as faculty advisor to the Lincoln Echo staff. Although Nan would leave Lincoln to pursue a career in advertising (DeMuesy Advertising & Marketing), her ties to Lincoln High remained strong. For over a decade Nan was the creative vision behind producing ten memorable May Fiestas with Ruth Cogan. Nan has been quoted as saying that "the years 1954-1964 were the happiest years of my life doing May Fiestas with Ruth Cogan." But Nan's years at Lincoln tell only a small portion of her story that has made her life so memorable for the Canton and North Canton communities.

Nan grew up as a "Hoover Baby" back when her father, Adam DeMuesy, worked for Boss Hoover as a company sales executive during a time when the Hoover Co. <u>was</u> North Canton. After Nan graduated from North Canton High (a cheerleader in 1943), she attended Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois, majoring in journalism and English education. As an indication of the impact that she made on Northwestern University, she received the university's "Outstanding Senior Woman" award the year she graduated. Two of Nan's close friends at Northwestern were young women who would rise to national prominence, both remaining friends of Nan throughout the years: Cloris Leachman (award-winning actress -*The Mary Tyler Moore Show*), now also 91 years young; and Erma Bombeck- famous author and humorist (1927-1996).

Nan's generous spirit is most clearly visible in her home town of North Canton. The statuary in front of the North Canton Library; the drinking fountain at City Hall Plaza; the high dive and life guard chair at Dogwood Park, and the plaque to the memory of Herbert W. Hoover Sr. (Boss Hoover's oldest son) on the new South Main Street bridge near 55th Street, are but a few examples of Nan's generous gifts to her home community. And if you have ever drawn water from the famous springhouse in Canton's Stadium Park, Nan is also the vision behind that locally famous spring being named in memory of the beloved pastor of Canton's Calvary Presbyterian Church, the Rev. John Barker.






